Municipal Reserve Designation Bylaw

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF MORINVILLE FOR THE PURPOSE OF REMOVING THE MUNICIPAL RESERVE DESIGNATION FROM A MUNICIPAL RESERVE LOT PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 674 AND 675, PART 17 OF THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT ACT, BEING CHAPTER M-26.1 OF THE REVISED STATUTES OF ALBERTA R.S.A. 2000 AND AMENDMENTS THERETO.

WHEREAS, the need exists for the Town of Morinville to establish/maintain leases in relation to the lands hereafter described;

AND WHEREAS, the lands hereafter described are not required for municipal reserve purposes;

AND WHEREAS, any proceeds from the leasing of the lands hereafter described are to be used as required by Section 675(3) of the *Municipal Government Act*;

AND WHEREAS, notice of the intention of Council to pass this bylaw has been given in accordance with Sections 606 and 674(2) of the *Municipal Government Act*;


NOW THEREFORE, the Municipal Council of the Town of Morinville, Alberta, duly assembled, hereby enacts as follows:

- 1.0 That the municipal reserve designation be removed by the Registrar of the Northern Alberta Land Titles Office from Lot 1R, Block 1, Plan 772 2356 as indicated on Schedule "A", attached to and forming part of this Bylaw, for the purpose of disposing of the same, the proceeds from the leasing of which being used as required by Section 675(3) of the *Municipal Government Act*.
- 2.0 That this Bylaw shall come into full force and effect upon the final passing thereof in accordance with Sections 189 and 213 of the *Municipal Government Act*.
- 3.0 **SEVERABILITY**
 - 3.1 If any Section or parts of this bylaw are found in any court of law to be illegal or beyond the power of Council to enact, such Section or parts shall be deemed to be severable and all other Sections or parts of this bylaw shall be deemed to be separate and independent there from and to be enacted as such.


READ a first time the 13th day of March, 2012
